ORDER

ORDERED that subject to the discretion of the presiding Judge, parties are expected to physically appear in court for all evidentiary proceedings scheduled to occur after July 30, 2020; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order shall apply to any hearing that was initially noticed for telephonic appearance only, but is scheduled to take place on or after July 30, 2020; and it is further

ORDERED that parties seeking to participate in a telephonic hearing must make arrangements to do so either by contacting CourtCall at 1-866-582-6878 or following the instructions on the Court's website; and it is further

ORDERED that social distancing and masking protocols will be followed at all hearings in accordance with "Court Operations During COVID-19" notice found on the Court's website.
